

CCGL9064: Creating your Visual Portfolio


This guide walks you through creating your visual portfolio using Adobe Portfolio. To begin, visit the Adobe Portfolio website and create a free account/login using your Adobe ID.



After logging in, you would be able to see the home screen which lists an array of portfolio templates. Choose the template you think would best showcase your work, and confirm your choice after previewing it.

Once you have selected your theme, you can start creating! You will be directed to your workspace where you can select the 'Add page' option to create your landing page.






After selecting the 'Add page' option, you will see a dialog box which lets you name your project and give it a destination. Make sure you check the box 'make this my homepage', and click on the button to create your page. You can now start building your page! Choose elements to add to your site as you wish using the white prompt as shown below.

Hover over your element until you see a blue addition sign to add more content to your project.






To customize text, image width or alignment, or any other part of your site, select the blue tag that appears on your element when you click on it. This opens the customizer on your screen's left where you can tweak settings to your preference. For instance, you can disable the 'Contact' portion of your project by deselecting it.




Scale images down and up by dragging the three-columned button that appears between adjacent images. You can also set a maximum width and adjust the padding between elements in the customizer.



When you are ready to set your portfolio live, click on the 'Publish Site' option on the bottom-left corner of your screen. You can even preview your work without publishing to see what your site would look like.



After hitting 'Publish Site', your site will be live! You can share your project's URL with others and view your site live.



You can always go back and make edits to your site once it has been published. And remember to have fun!
